finances

income versus expenses; use of available resources
Notes: client states he is unaware of available resources

finances

crisis intervention/short-range planning; long-range planning/decision making; budgeting; community resources

Case Management

finances

community resources
Notes: referred to medical office regarding options available to him

Social contact

Priority: High
Severity: Health Promotion

Scope: Individual
Knowledge: 2 - Minimal knowledge
Behavior: 4 - Usually appropriate
Status: 5 - No signs/symptoms
Identified: 03/16/2010
Problem Notes: *client is divorced; lives alone and is not currently in a relationship*

Assess (Surveillance)

support system

supportive network; adequate/appropriate
Notes: client states that he and his ex-wife communicate frequently

support group

Notes: indicated to client that support group meets on the third Wednesday of every month at the local YMCA.

Communicable/infectious condition

Priority: High
Severity: Actual
Scope: Family

Signs/Symptoms

● positive screening/culture/laboratory results
Knowledge: 2 - Minimal knowledge
Behavior: 2 - Rarely appropriate
Status: 4 - Minimal signs/symptoms
Identified: 03/16/2010
Problem Notes: *client dx on 2/15/2010 with positive blood test for HIV*

Interventions

Assess (Surveillance)

signs/symptoms-physical

evidence of disease/infection; pain/tenderness/health status-height-weight-mobility
Notes: client states he went to have blood work done for a routine new employment physical; states his primary MD called to notify him that he was positive for HIV; states he is asymptomatic

education

knowledge of disease and transmission, treatment options
Notes: client states that his doctor told him to call his ex-wife and have her and their kids tested; client states the tests were negative

Teaching, Guidance and Counseling

behavior modification

make choices to promote health; recognize/change personal patterns; safe sex behaviors; use good technique to prevent

spread/promote healing
Notes: gave client the HIV 101 pamphlet
education
disease progression/reduce risk of transmission

Case Management

continuity of care
coordination among providers; follows plan of care; contact follow-up
Notes: scheduled appt with county HIV MD for March 30, 2010 at 10am

Substance use

Priority: High
Severity: Potential
Knowledge: 4 - Adequate knowledge
Behavior: 4 - Usually appropriate
Status: 5 - No signs/symptoms
Identified: 03/16/2010
Problem Notes: risk factors: previous hx of drug use; current alcohol use

Interventions

Assess (Surveillance)

signs/symptoms-physical
history and current level of use;
withdrawal/cravings; long-term effects/risk for illness/disease

Medication regimen

Priority: High
Severity: Potential
Scope: Individual
Knowledge: 2 - Minimal knowledge
Behavior: 4 - Usually appropriate
Status: 5 - No signs/symptoms
Identified: 03/16/2010
Problem Notes: Risk factors: past hx of medication noncompliance

Interventions

Assess (Surveillance)

medication administration
ability to take HIV meds as prescribed
Notes: states primary MD placed him on AZT and Ritonavir on 2/22/10. client stated he has taken them daily as prescribed

Teaching, Guidance and Counseling

medication action/side effects
important to take as prescribed; purpose/benefits
Notes: gave client HIV Meds 101 pamphlet
